City of Boyden Minutes of Monthly Council Meeting January 13, 2020

Mayor Laryl Koerselman called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m.

Council members present were Robin Jungers, Justin Beukelman, and Dale Winter.

Kim Ochsendorf arrived at 5:40 and Nathan Alexander arrived at 6:05.

Others present were Jeff Meyn, Brent Steven, and city employees Blake Snieder and Tami Kamies.

Robin Jungers read and signed an oath stating her taking on the responsibility of the Boyden City Council.

Jeff Meyn discussed improvements that the school would like to see at the softball diamond. Items include to remove the grass behind home and along first and third bases, maintaining the field after it has been used by the public and on weekends, maintaining the weeds, and sprinkler system. The city will try to accommodate and help with some of these issues when the weather allows for work at the field.

Brent Steven was in regarding the second ambulance of the city. His recommendation would be that the city look in to selling the ambulance. The city pays to maintain and stock the ambulance each year and it is used very little. Beukelman made a motion to put the ambulance on gov deals with a reserve on \$10,000 and see what interest we get. Ochsendorf supported. Motion carried 5-0.

Maintenance items: Blake requested from the council approval to purchase a grapple for moving trees and branches. Alexander made a motion to approve the purchase. Jungers supported. Motion carried 5-0.

The sewer main project is near completion. The city approved the certificate of payment #1 and signed the agreement for the project.

Consent Agenda: Councilman Beukelman made a motion to approve the December Financials, the minutes from the December 9 minutes, bills in the amount of \$106,331.68 and the building permits for Austin Loges and John Beyer. Ochsendorf supported. Motion carried 5-0.

The council reviewed the committees within the city. The committees will be as follows:

Street/Sewer/Garbage/Water – Winter, Beukelman; Facilities/Fire/Ambulance – Jungers, Ochsendorf; Finance – Alexander, Winter; Cemetery – Ochsendorf, Kamies; Employee/Ordinance – Beukelman, Koerselman; Library – Jungers, Beukelman; Park – Winter, Alexander.

Beukelman made a motion to approve the Depository Resolution 2020-01. Alexander supported. Motion carried 5-0.

Alexander made a motion to approve the Resolution 2020-02 stating the wages for the 2020 year. Ochsendorf supported. Motion carried 5-0.

The council discussed the request, from a potential buyer of the property at 1001 Sherman Street, for them to be able to put up to 15 nanny goats on the property. Ochsendorf made a motion to approve them having up to 15 goats on the property. Alexander supported. Motion passed 3-1. Beukelman abstained.

The council had a discussion regarding items that will be budgeted for with the fiscal year 2021 year. Resolution 2020-3 setting date for public hearing for the max levy rate. Winter made a motion to set February 10 as the public hearing date for the max levy rate hearing. Alexander supported. Motion carried 5-0.

With no further business Alexander made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Winter supported. Motion carried 5-0. Meeting was adjourned at 8:05 p.m.
