Alexander made a motion to approve the Annual Urban Renewal Report for FY 2020 that was presented to the council. Winter supported. Motion carried 5-0.

The council will set up a meeting with the DNR and NRCS to discuss the possibility of putting in a wetland/pond area to help with potential flooding within the city. The discussion will include possible funding options as well as maintenance requirements of the area. The meeting will be scheduled either the 21st or 22nd of October.

The city declined the quotes that were received on the park paving project on October 5th. The city will be rebidding the project with a completion date in the spring of 2021 in hopes to receive more quotes from contractors that are able to perform the project. The projected date of completion the city would like is May 1st, 2021.
