City of Boyden Minutes of Monthly Council Meeting June 10, 2019

Mayor Laryl Koerselman called the meeting to order at 5:58 p.m.

Council members present were Dale Winter, Bob Koerselman, Kim Ochsendorf and Nathan Alexander. Justin Beukelman was absent.

Others present were city employees Tami Kamies and Blake Snieder.

Mayor Koerselman opened the meeting with the public hearing for the adoption for the "Code of Ordinances of the City of Boyden" at 5:58 pm.

There were no written or oral comments regarding the code of ordinances. Councilman Ochsendorf made a motion to waive the first and second reading and move to pass the Ordinance Adopting the "Code of Ordinances". Winter supported. Motion was carried 4-0.

The public hearing was closed at 6:02.

The council has decided that they do not want to make the alley between Colfax & Morningside Streets a through alley. They will talk with residents regarding the right of way in the alley that does exist to make what is there accessible for the people who do use it.

Blake presented to the council that the city will need to purchase a different mower to mow the cemetery. The cost of the mower will be shared with the Sheridan Township. B. Koerselman made a motion that the city purchase a 2016 X-Mark mower from Sheldon Power & Equipment. Alexander second the motion. Motion was carried 4-0.

The council discuss the issue of a few residents with sewer backing up into their houses during the large rain event that we recently had. The city is currently in the process of replacing the main sewer line that goes out of town to the lagoon. That project is set to be done later this fall/winter. The current line that is there allows for a lot of infiltration of ground water from the field which causes backups in the lagoons especially when we receive several inches of rain. The new line will not allow the infiltration which in turn will produce less water getting into the lagoon. The hope would be that this will help eliminate the problem. Also, the city encourages citizens to put a check valve in their sewer line if they do want to try and prevent sewer backups in their homes.

Consent Agenda: Councilman B. Koerselman made a motion to pass the May Financials, the minutes from the May 13 meeting, the bills in the amount of 83,341.60, and the building permits for Gene De Vos and Charles Van Veldhuizen. Ochsendorf supported. Motion carried 4-0.

The city has had a person interested in purchasing the property on the corner of Main and Taft Street from the city. The city is willing to consider the request with the approval of the building permit of what is intended to be put on the property.

Councilman Ochsendorf made a motion that the Boyden Ambulance will sign a contract with Orange City Area Health Systems for paramedic assist. B. Koerselman supported. Motion carried 4-0.

Alexander made a motion that the city will have Williams & Company out of Sheldon perform the annual Fiscal Year 2019 examination. Winter supported. Motion carried 4-0.

The city will sign a contract with the Sioux County Sheriff's Office for police protection for Boyden for \$82,590.00 for the fiscal year 2020.

Alexander made a motion that the city sewer rate will increase 50 cents for the minimum fee and 35 cents per thousand gallons for residents and out of town residents. It will increase 2.00 for the minimum fee and 50 cents per thousand gallons for commercial and industrial businesses. Winter supported. Motion carried 4-0.

With no further business Alexander made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Winter supported. Motion carried 4-0. Meeting was adjourned at 7:30 p.m.
